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Rev Dr Peter Walker

Peter was Professor of Biblical Studies at Trinity School for Ministry (near Pittsburgh, USA) from 2012 to 2017. He studied Classics and Early Church History at Cambridge University and then did extensive research at post-doctoral level on attitudes to Jerusalem within the Bible and the era of the early church. For many years he taught at Wycliffe Hall within the University of Oxford and has led guided tours to the lands of the Bible for over 30 years. Peter Walker is widely acknowledged as one of the foremost experts on the Holy Land. His book, *In the Steps of Jesus*, has come to be recognized as the authoritative guide for Christian visitors.

Dr Catherine Wilcox

AFTER DINNER SPEAKER

Dr Catherine Wilcox is a senior lecturer in Creative Writing at Manchester Metropolitan University, and academic director of The Manchester Writing School. She was educated at Durham and London Universities and has a degree in English and a doctorate in Theology. Writing as Catherine Fox, she is author of eight novels that explore themes of the spiritual and the physical with insight and humour. Her *Lindchester Chronicles* are published by Marylebone House/SPCK."



Rev Graham Archer

Graham's passion for growing local churches is impossible to ignore, with over 30 years working as a missionary, pastor and church planter. Having qualified as a biochemist, Graham spent two years working for a missionary society in Japan before training for ordination. He served his curacy in Ipswich before planting churches in Ipswich and Felixstowe for the next 14 years. He was a vicar in Southampton for 13 years, before starting his role at CPAS in October 2012. His role involves the leadership and management of CPAS' work across the UK and Republic of Ireland, leadership training and patronage appointments.



Rev Liz Devall

Liz was ordained 11 years ago and is a parish priest in the Manchester Diocese. She has taught prayer and spirituality on the Authorised Lay Ministry course and has taken a lead on diocesan prayer events. She has a particular interest in pilgrimage having been chaplain on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land and Jordan. Liz has developed Virtual pilgrimages during lockdown which incorporated her skills as an amateur photographer. Liz will be the chaplain during the conference.

Postcode – **DE55 1AU**

The Hayes Conference Centre is only 5 miles from the M1. From **junction 28 of the M1** take the **A38** dual carriageway towards Derby. Leave the A38 at the exit marked **A615 Matlock/A61 Chesterfield** and as the roundabout take the **B6179** towards Swanwick and Ripley. After 0.8 miles turn left (**B6016**) at the traffic light crossroads by the church in the centre of Swanwick. 500 yards down the road, past the school buildings, turn right signed 'Conference Centre' into Hayes Lane. The Conference Centre is straight ahead.

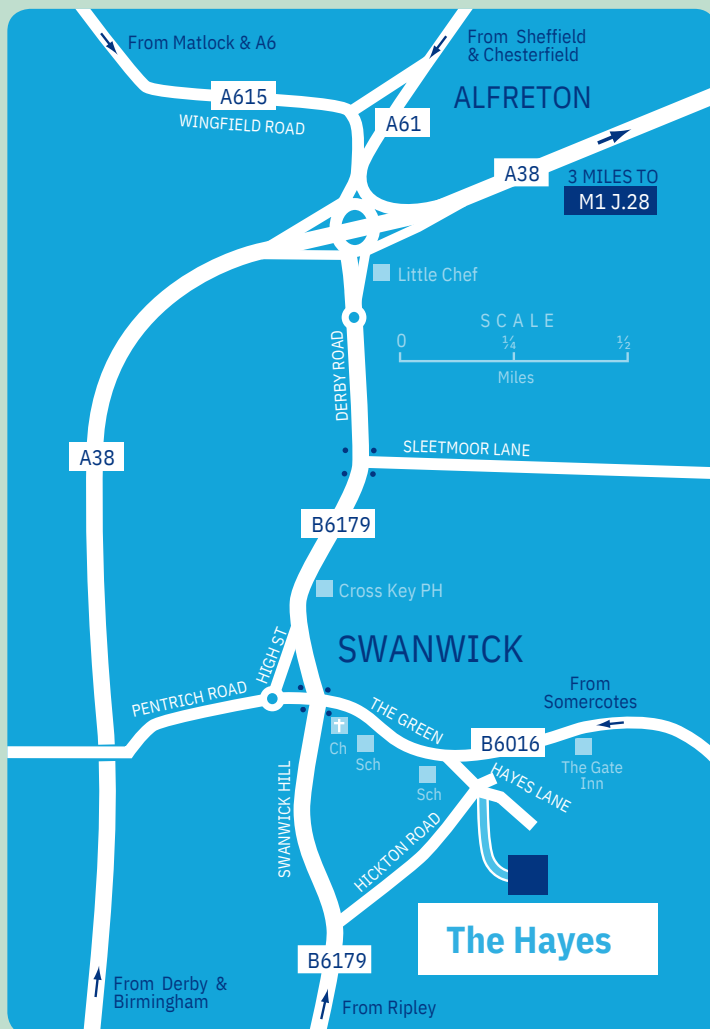
BY BUS

From **Derby**, catch the 9.1, 9.2, or 9.3 bus from Stand C2 on Corporation Street and ask to be dropped opposite 'The Gate' pub in Swanwick. Walk down Hates Lane and the Conference Centre is straight ahead - approximately a 5minute walk.

from **Alfreton**, catch the 9.1, 9.2, or 9.3 bus (towards Derby) from either the bus or train station and ask to be dropped outside 'The Gate' pub in Swanwick. Walk down Hates Lane and the Conference Centre is straight ahead - approximately a 5minute walk.

MAP TO GET YOU TO OUR DOOR



BY RAIL

Our local station is **Alfreton Station** on the Sheffield-Nottingham and Liverpool to Norwich lines, and it is about 3 miles from the station to The Hayes.

Please be advised that there is no lift available at Alfreton Station, so passengers may need to continue their journey on to a fully accessible station and return back to Alfreton in order to arrive on the accessible side of the station.

Some guests may prefer to travel to **Derby Station**, with direct lines from London, then catch a bus (see left) or taxi from Derby to The Hayes. N.B. Derby Station is 1 mile from the centre of Derby, all buses heading into town from the station all stop at the bus station.

We recommend that you pre-book taxis if arriving at Alfreton and Derby stations. Our recommended reliable taxi company is **Amber Taxis 01773 836100**. As a guide, Amber Taxis charge £25.00 from Derby Station to The Hayes, and £6.00 from Alfreton Station to The Hayes (please quote 'The Hayes' to ensure these rates).

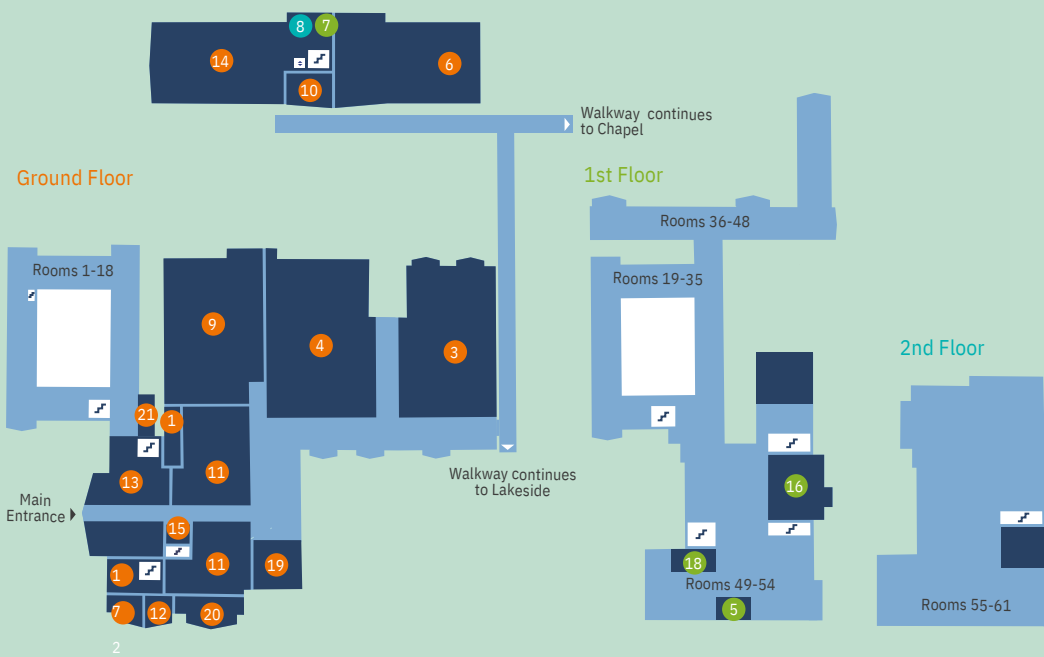

SITE PLAN

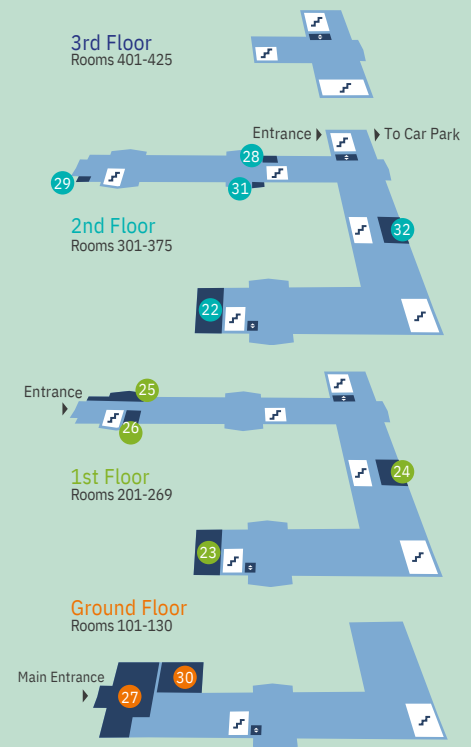

USEFUL INFORMATION

Arrival and Check In

Arrival and registration is from **15:30 on 14th November**. Check in will take place at the Lakeside accommodation and there is parking next to our rooms (please see site map). You will be handed your name badge, lanyard, and room key and you will be able to access your room at this time. **Check out is 9:30am on Thursday 17th November** and rooms will need to be cleared by this time. At the end of the conference you must return your lanyard and key otherwise there will be a charge.

Most delegates have elected to make their own way to the conference which makes the cost of provision of a coach prohibitive. Delegates are asked to car share where possible. Information about public transport is included in this booklet.

Food and Drink

Meals will be served in the dining rooms. Breakfast is served as a rolling buffet between 8am-9am but please note that our first session starts at 8:45am. Lunch is a lighter meal option and will be served at 1pm. Dinner is a hot sit-down meal and will be served at 6:45pm.

There will be a conference dinner on Wednesday evening.

The Hayes bar offers a wide range of alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks as well as snacks, making it the perfect place to unwind and catch up with others. Fairtrade tea, coffee and other hot drinks are available from the Lounge throughout the day - please help yourself. **Please note that the bar takes payment by card only.**

Coffee machines are available in the main house from 8am-8pm every day. These are free to use.

Chaplaincy

The chaplain for our conference is Rev Liz Devall. Liz is available for prayer and counsel throughout the conference and will be available either by approaching her wherever you happen to be, or meeting by arrangement in the designated chaplain room (small room off Butterley 1).

Delegates will be accommodated in their own bedroom with en-suite bathrooms. Rooms are finished to a high standard and have either a shower, or bath and shower combined. Complimentary towels, soap, toiletries, and a hairdryer are included to make your stay as comfortable as possible.

In the second edition of Peter Walker's established text, readers take a pilgrimage through the Holy Land, discovering for themselves the rich historical aspects of Jesus's world.

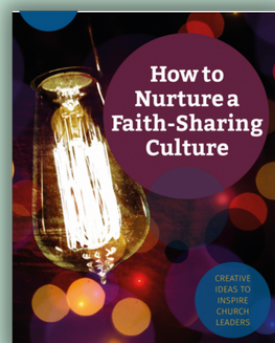
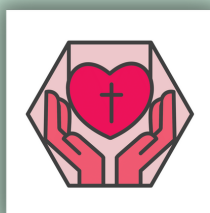
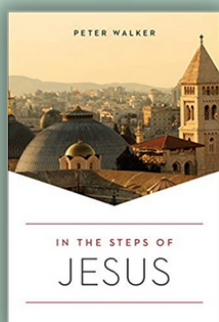
Following the chronology of Jesus's life and ministry, drawing especially on the Gospel of Luke, *In the Steps of Jesus* guides readers through Bethlehem, Nazareth, and the desert to Jesus's final journey from Galilee to Jerusalem. Each chapter gives particular attention to the work Jesus did in the location--placing his ministry within its original historical and geographical context--and raises questions on the archaeology, authenticity, and recorded evidence of later pilgrims and historians. This new edition takes into account the archaeological discoveries of the last fifteen years to provide an up-to-date guide to the Holy Land of today. Using maps, timelines, and boxed features to highlight special topics of interest, *In the Steps of Jesus* serves as an expert introduction to the most prominent sites of the New Testament.

If you've ever wanted to tread the boards or you just fancy a good old-fashioned singalong, then this workshop is for you.

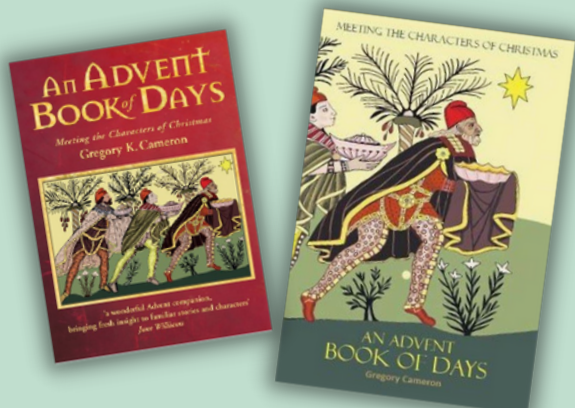
Release your inner diva and have fun in this relaxed hour of singing the hits from musicals.
