Prayer of St Richard of Chichester

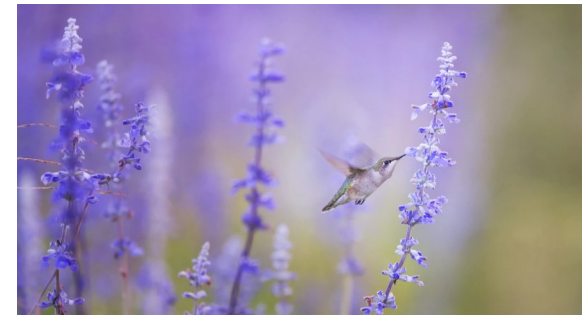
O dear Lord,
